12 how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead?

- <sup>1</sup>"Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the **gospel** I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand.
- <sup>2</sup> By this **gospel** <u>you are saved</u>, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain. <sup>3</sup> For what I received I passed on to you as <u>of first importance</u>:

3b that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, 4 that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, 5 and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve.'

<sup>14</sup> And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith.

## Did Jesus really rise from the dead?

3b that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, 4 that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, 5 and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve.'

<sup>6</sup>After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. <sup>7</sup> Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, <sup>8</sup> and last of all he appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born.

## Why is Jesus' resurrection 'good news' for us?

<sup>20</sup> But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. 21 For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man. <sup>22</sup> For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive. 23 But each in turn: Christ, the firstfruits; then, when he comes, those who belong to him.
